

Welcome

Thanks for your interest in studying abroad in Seoul, South Korea and Japan!

What is the Study Tour Program and how is it different from Study Abroad?

The Study Tour Program gives Pierce College students the opportunity to take Pierce College classes with a professor from Pierce in a different country. This study tour program offers a 2 week course overseas, allowing for students with jobs or families the opportunity to study overseas with a shorter time commitment. The other big difference is the price. Once admitted to the program, students will then register for the Study Tour course offered, and the price for the course will be no different than regular cost of tuition at Pierce College. The only expenses the student will pay outside of tuition will be their airfare, reduced lodging and meals. Please see pg 5 for more details on pricing. Our partnerships with Sangmyung University and Korea Polytechnics College in Seoul, South Korea and Japan will provide lodging at a reduced charge to our students. You will have the opportunity to earn 5 credits towards your degree during the 2 week program- either Art 100 OR HUM 101. Both can count as a GTE/GE. Please check with your advisor to make sure the program courses fit with your academic plan.

When will the 2018 Study Tour Occur?

The dates are: July 8th SeaTac to Tokyo, travel to Seoul July 16th, return to Seattle July 22nd.

Weekly Schedule:

The Study Tour is not a vacation!! It's a STUDY Tour. Key word, STUDY. If you are a student who values experiential learning, and would like to experience learning come to life, this is the trip for you. The GPA requirement for participants is a minimum of 2.5. Your instructor has unique excursions and outings planned for you that will be integrated into their lectures. Class may be held in a local museum, at a local tourist site, in a park, in a restaurant, or at the host institution. The goal is to provide an enriching cultural experience, while still meeting all of the course outcomes and credit hours. Your schedule will not be a 9-5 schedule. Every hour of your day will be packed with cultural excursions, class time, and social outings with local students, and specially panned tourist activities. If you are wanting a truly unique cultural experience, with the opportunity to learn about your host nation with the locals, and earn 5 credits through an engaging course curriculum, then this is the trip for you. If you are looking to party, have free time, and make this your vacation, then this is not the right fit!!

What Will We Be Doing?

Learning through unique cultural experiences, and instruction by a Pierce College faculty member and faculty, staff and students of the host institutions.

Study Tour Expectations

What You Can Expect

In order for us to fulfill our program's mission and goals, it is imperative that all participants fully engage in all aspects of their Study Tour. Being a Study Tour participant requires time, energy, and commitment, including meeting requirements before, during, and after the Study Tour. Below are details about what we expect of Study Tour participants:

We Expect That You Will...

- Attend ALL pre-trip activities and meetings. These meetings will help you become familiar with the Korean and Japanese Culture and learn some of the dos and don'ts while on your trip.
- Participate actively in any pre-trip fundraising events with your group to assist in covering the cost of the trip. Scholarships are available on a need basis.
- Participate actively in all aspects of your trip, including classes, reflection, and activities.
 You will respect others in your group and be willing to cooperate. You will be flexible,
 open-minded, and responsible as a representative of Pierce College.
- Understand that the use of drugs and alcohol is strictly prohibited; You will be expected to abide by the Pierce Code of Conduct throughout the trip.
- Obtain a passport, prior to your trip- insurance is MANDATORY and will be

- will be included in program cost.
- Every student is individually responsible for the success of the trip and must exercise good judgment, respect the rights and feelings of others, and observe the laws and customs of the host country.

In Return, You Can Expect To...

- Receive direction and support from the Department of International Education in the form of training and resources prior to your trip.
- Receive transportation, lodging and excursions.
- Be educated about your trip location and host site.
- Have a once in a lifetime experience!

Expectations for KOREA:

- Lodging is dorm style, you will be likely sharing a dorm room with a student of the same gender.
- Breakfast and Lunch in the cafeteria or at nearby restaurants cost approximately \$5.00 for each meal. Dinner in town can range from \$10-\$20.
- Many of your excursions will be accessible via the subway or by taxi (this is the most common and best way to get around in the city). Each bus ride is about \$1, and each taxi ride is about \$2.00. You will be responsible for purchasing your rechargeable subway card and paying for transportation on group excursions. The entry fees to any museums or cultural attractions as part of the program are included in your payment to Pierce College.

Expectations for JAPAN:

- You will share a room with another member or two of the trip, same gender.
- Breakfast is included at the hotel. Lunch costs can range between \$5.00 and \$10.00 and dinner can range from \$8-\$30 depending on the location.
- Many of your excursions will be accessible via the subway. When riding the subway, each
 ride is about \$2.50-4.00. You will be responsible for purchasing your rechargeable
 subway card and paying for transportation on group excursions. The entry fees to any
 museums or cultural attractions as part of the program are included in your payment to
 Pierce College.

Cost, Payments and Fundraising:

Total cost due to Pierce College for the Study Tour: \$2,500.00

This Includes: Airfare, lodging, some meals, entrance fees for excursion sites & mandatory travel insurance

This does not include: Tuition - Approx for 5 Credits: \$560.80

Meals - Approx \$400.00

Subway/Public Transpo - Approx \$150.00

Scholarships: Limited scholarships are available and awarded based upon financial need. Scholarship participants are still required to pay the deposit amount + insurance with their agreement package.

^{*}Incidentals such as souvenirs and expenses on "free days" - Approx. \$200.00

Due May 1st – Deposit: \$500 + \$25.50 insurance

(This payment is non-refundable, but can be put toward another study tour trip if an emergency arises. Payment in Full also welcome at this time.)

Due May 23rd – Final Trip Cost Payment: \$1974.50 scholarships due.

Due June 13 – Class Tuition (estimated \$560.80 for 5 credits. Scholarships available!)

Once your first payment and your agreement package is received, you will be given the orientation dates. You may register for the course at the first orientation.
