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

BUSY MOM, SERVICEMEMBER AND STUDENT FINDS SUCCESS WITH HELP FROM PIERCE COLLEGE AT JBLM

As a young single mom and college student, Lindsay Williams was unsure what the future held for her and her son. At the time, the Texas native was a Texas Southern University student struggling to balance school and parenthood, and she ultimately left college to find a job that would help to support her and her son.

Over the course of the next five years, Wiliams, 28, worked a series of part-time jobs, never really finding her passion. After meeting her husband and learning more about his time in the military, she had a bit of a breakthrough. "He really got me thinking about the idea of joining the military since it had such an impact on his life," Williams said. "I was ready to

make a change in my life and do something that I could be proud of. I joined the military in 2017, and truly feel like I've changed for the better as a result"

Now based on Joint Base Lewis-McChord, she and her husband are balancing their careers with raising three boys: Mason, 8, Mars, 2, and Maddox, 8 months.

Williams' time in the military inspired her to go back to college through Pierce College at JBLM, where she is double majoring in pre-nursing and computer network engineering. "I've always thought about the idea of becoming a nurse, and I kept hearing about what a great program Pierce College has," she said.

Williams plans to transfer to a nursing school at a local university after graduating from Pierce College. Although she admits it's not easy finishing college as a wife and parent while serving in the military, she credits Pierce College advisors for making sure she is set up for success each quarter. "My advisors at Pierce College at JBLM work closely with me on my degree plan and have been so helpful and understanding about my demanding schedule," Williams said.

Williams' hard work in her classes has more than paid off this year, as she recently received Pierce College at JBLM's Military Academic Achievement Award for excellence. With a 3.69 GPA, she is on track to contine her

tradition of excellence into the future. "I was surprised and blown away by this award," Williams said. "I was working so hard in my classes, and this just motivated me to keep going and not give up. I am so grateful that Pierce College is making it possible for me to earn my degree and succeed in college while serving in the military."

GOVERNOR JAY INSLEE VISITS PIERCE COLLEGE PUYALLUP

Dierce College Puyallup was proud to host Governor Jay Inslee and Washington's First Lady Trudi Inslee on Monday, Feb. 3, during a special visit to campus. After learning about Pierce's innovative Guided Pathways work, Gov. Inslee's office requested a tour of the campus and a chance to meet with students, faculty and staff from across the district.

Puyallup with Chancellor Michele Johnson, Gov. Inslee participated in a roundtable discussion about the work the college is doing to help students be successful inside the classroom and beyond.

Students from across the district participated in the discussion, sharing their own personal journeys that led them to Pierce College. Chundranae McGary is working toward her Bachelor of Applied Science in Teaching, and credits much of her success to the dedication of her professors. "My professors truly care about students, and make it a priority to help us be successful," she said. "I am so grateful to be in this bachelor's program, because it's giving me an opportunity to become

a teacher and make a larger impact in our schools. Without Pierce, I wouldn't be able to do that."

Dr. Johnson shared with Gov. Inslee the news about Pierce College's position in the Aspen Institute's Top 5 community colleges in the nation, and what that means to our students as they prepare for their next chapters. "Our students deserve to have the resources they need to be successful and leave with the skills they need to transfer, finish a baccalaureate degree with us, or to go on to work," Dr. Johnson said. "Our 2025 goal is for equity, completion and beyond. We need to provide more than just access. We need to provide the resources for students to be successful."

Representatives from student government, Nursing, TRiO, ASPIRE, and Early Childhood Education also shared their own stories about why they chose to attend Pierce College, and the impact it's had on their lives.

"Funding community and technical colleges is critically important," Gov. Inslee said. "The citizens of Washington believe in you, and believe in your mission, and I hope all of you will continue to advocate for your college in the community. We want to keep the resources going and make sure citizens know that community and technical colleges are worth paying taxes for. People are inspired by your personal stories, as am I, and I thank you for sharing them with us."

AT PIERCE COLLEGE, FINISH YOUR HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA WHILE EARNING COLLEGE CREDIT

In an innovative program designed for adult learners, Pierce College allows students to finish their high school diploma while earning college credit simultaneously. For \$25 per quarter, students can take classes for credit toward their high school diploma.

The Pierce College Adult Diploma (PCAD) program features rigorous courses that prepare students for success in college. During their final quarter in the program, students enroll in college-level courses, earning college credit while finishing their high school diploma requirements. The Pierce College Board of Trustees chose to waive tuition for students enrolled in college courses while completing their high school requirements.

"We want students to realize they are capable of being successful in college," said Chancellor Michele Johnson. "We worked hard to remove any financial barriers that may be keeping them from transitioning into college."

The PCAD program is designed to help students understand their potential by demonstrating they can be successful in college. Many students in the program never imagined graduating from high school, much less being successful in college.


"Many of our students come here for the basic goal to earn a high school diploma, and have no intention of ever going to college," said Transitional Education Dean Lori Griffin. "But when they experience success in college during that final quarter, we are hoping they will continue their education and be confident they can do well in a degree or certificate program."

PIERCE COLLEGE **PROGRAM SAVES STUDENTS** \$2 MILLION IN TEXTBOOK COSTS

hanks to the Pierce Open Pathways (POP) program offered at Pierce College at JBLM, students have saved more than \$2 million in textbook costs since 2015. Courses in the program use open educational resources, which are highquality, openly licensed learning resources used in lieu of traditional textbooks.

Students in the program can earn an entire university transfer degree without ever paying for a traditional textbook. Each of these online learning resources are vetted by Pierce College officials to ensure high quality materials for each course.



continue to grow, according to Pierce College at JBLM Executive Director Mark Haskins. "It's important to remember that OER is not just about savings, but it's also about relevant, flexible course materials." Haskins said. "This program is a powerful example of what we try to do to reduce barriers for our military-affiliated students. While military tuition assistance (TA) provides an excellence educational benefit for service members, it cannot be used to pay for textbooks, which can be a significant expense. Students in our OER classes have little to no out-of-pocket costs, further making us one of the most accessible schools and best values in education for the military."

PIERCE COLLEGE **LAUNCHES NEW PART-TIME LPN TO RN PROGRAM**

Pierce College recently launched a new program that will allow Licensed Practical Nurses (LPN) to earn their Registered Nursing (RN) credentials on a part-time basis. This new part-time program is designed especially for working LPNs, with classes taking place during evenings and weekends.

Applications are being accepted now through March 13, for the first part-time cohort starting Summer Quarter 2020. The fivequarter program will combine both lecture courses with hands-on learning experiences.

"We're looking forward to welcoming our first class of part-time LPN to RN students," said Nursing Program Director Tiffany Smith-Fromm. "It will be difficult working full time as an LPN while going to school, even with a smaller course load. We're looking for students who are up to the challenge, and who are dedicated to staying focused."

The program is competitive, and Smith-Fromm's advice to prospective nursing students is to pay careful attention to the application instructions. "It's also important to answer survey questions with a lot of self-reflection and insight into why they want to become a registered nurse," she said.

The college still offers a full-time LPN to RN program, which welcomes a new cohort of 32 students each spring quarter. Pierce College also offers a traditional Associate Degree in Nursing, which students complete in six quarters. Every other fall, 32 students are accepted into the program.

By the end of their programs, Pierce College nursing students are well-prepared to sit for the National Council Licensure Exam for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN). Pierce College nursing students have passed the exam at historically high rates, and the program has been recognized statewide for its success in helping students to move into in-demand nursing careers quickly upon graduation.
