WELCOME BACK!

What a difference a year makes! Over the past year, we've all had to adapt to a worldwide pandemic virtually overnight. We had to move to remote classes, canceled in-person social events, implemented mask requirements, and maintained social distancing. The good news is that Washington state is opening up now, which means we can offer more classes and student services in-person, while still offering remote options that many of you have come to appreciate as you balance your life responsibilities.


