PIERCE COLLEGE STUDENT TURNS HER LIFE AROUND

Juggling a toddler, home business, recovery, and college courses at the same time sounds like a difficult task for anyone to manage. Yet for Heather Green, 27, she is incredibly grateful for the challenge as she works to provide a better life for her four-year-old daughter.

Heather was only 12 years old when her parents separated, and she was introduced to alcohol and other substances. "I started going down the rabbit hole of addiction, and my dad passed away from alcoholism when I was only 17," she said.

She struggled throughout her time in grade school, and continued to use alcohol as a way

to deal with the stress of life. "I had a lot of trauma from my past that I used as an excuse to drink," Heather said.

She found herself pregnant and in an unhealthy relationship at 22 years old. By the time she had her daughter, she was alone and struggling with feelings of doubt that were only exacerbated by her alcoholic tendencies. "It wasn't long after I had my daughter that I realized I had a problem," she said. "I had tried to get sober for my daughter, but I really had to get miserable enough to truly want this for myself."

Heather's first year of sobriety was especially difficult, as she not only lost her grandmother, but also

lost three friends to accidental drug overdoses. She held strong and achieved 18 months of sobriety by the time she began to consider going back to college. "I knew I was smart and I could do it, but it was scary because I hadn't been in school in seven years," she said.

Heather started the process of finding a community college close to home to earn her associate's before moving on to a university. "I found Pierce College, and saw that it was one of the top 5 community colleges in the nation, and that was really appealing to me," she said. "Going back to school was an intimidating thought, but I was ready. Luckily, I had a wonderful advisor at Pierce who encouraged me to only take a couple courses my first quarter to start slow."

It didn't take Heather long to get comfortable in the classroom again, and she quickly learned about the many support resources available to students both on and off-campus. She regularly used the Writing Center online, where she was able to upload assignments and have staff review them and provide feedback.

Heather ultimately excelled in her classes, and even landed on the President's List (3.9-3.99 GPA) and Chancellor's List (4.0 GPA) during her time at Pierce. Heather was also named to the All-Washington Academic Team, and was ultimately ranked in the Top 16 students in Washington state.

Heather will be transferring to Oregon State University this Summer to begin her journey earning a double-major in business management and sustainability. With tentative plans to earn a master's degree and become a successful businesswoman, her overall goal is to have a positive impact on the lives of her future colleagues.

"I have such an immense amount of gratitude for being able to get sober at a young age, and now I get to help others in the process," Heather said. "I always knew I was capable of getting good grades, but now I finally have an intrinsic motivation to attend school and be successful. It feels amazing to have come this far." ■

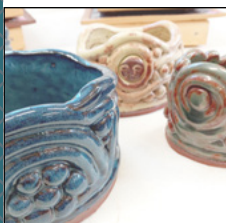


Mastering the Art of Large Concrete Leaves
