

HOW RETURNING TO SCHOOL REIGNITED ONE STUDENT'S PASSION FOR THE ARTS By Abbie Shuli

reva Adkins is not your traditional college student. She's a mom of four and at 43, she's often in classes at Pierce College with friends of her teenaged son. But what really sets her apart is her drive to succeed despite any circumstances.

"I love to learn," Adkins said. "But I also really love to be successful."

In high school, Adkins struggled with math courses but excelled as an artist; however, she had teachers who were less-than supportive who convinced her college wouldn't be worth the cost for her.

"Nobody was asking me what my plan was post-high school," Adkins said. "I didn't have anybody who was rooting for me."

She eventually became a "jack of all
trades" working as a massage therapist,
a barista, a bartender, a server, a
caterer, an event coordinator, andnational
colleges."I though
even a flagger."But same

"I was good at everything because I'm dedicated," Adkins said. "But I still felt I wasn't smart enough for college."

Things changed when Adkins received a diagnosis of attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, or ADHD, and in her late thirties. Working with her

doctors, Adkins found a treatment that worked and decided to couple it with learning something new.

"I started by doing new outfits, doing something new every day, and spending time with friends," Adkins said. "When I decided to go back to school, I was scared I couldn't do it. My husband said: "what's the worst that could happen, if it sucks you can drop out."

But Adkins fell in love with her classes. Even though her first courses were online, she would still make herself go to campus every day, where she would diligently work on her coursework in the computer labs. Her hard work paid off, and she earned a 4.0 GPA in her first quarter, landed on the dean's list and was offered membership in Phi Theta Kappa, the national honors society for two-year colleges.

"I thought it was a fluke," Adkins said. "But same thing second quarter, I got a 4.0 and I felt I started to really shine."

After three straight quarters of a 4.0 GPA, making the dean's list, and feeling "like a rockstar" Adkins decided to tackle her dreaded, required mathematics course. She ended up with a 3.99 that term, the lowest in



her entire 8 quarter career at Pierce College. She credits her high academic achievement on her dedication to studying and finding tools that work for her.

"I learned how to handle my own learning disability," Adkins said. "I'm upfront with my teachers and if the learning isn't working for me, I let them know. I would make flashcards and punched a hole in each card when I learned something, just to see the confetti. Basically, I clicker trained myself."

Adkins graduated with her Associate of Arts in June 2024; however, this fall, she's back at Pierce College pursuing a certificate in digital design. One reason she decided to come back to continue her education is her desire to learn from all of the available art instructors at Pierce College.

"They're such special people," Adkins said. "The art department has interested, talented professionals who are teaching here for the love of teaching."

Adkins says Pierce College art instructors, such as Mike Hall, helped her find success in her own way. Hall fostered a love of painting in Adkins, whose art has been featured in SLAM, the student literary and arts magazine at Pierce College, and the summer art show at Tacoma Community College.

For future students, Adkins said the best thing you can do is get involved with campus life.

"The community here is amazing," said Adkins, who serves as editor of the Puyallup edition of The Pinnacle, the Pierce College student newspaper. "I don't know anybody who doesn't say Pierce is special. There is some kind of magic about this school."

PIERCE COLLEGE OPENS NEWEST ACADEMIC BUILDING, EXPANDING STEM EDUCATION AT PUYALLUP CAMPUS

his fall, Pierce College students headed back to our Puyallup campus with a new addition: the Johnson Science Building. This state-of-the-art building offers classrooms, labs, study space and more for students studying science, technology, engineering, and math.

On October 16, the Pierce College community celebrated the grand opening of the newest academic building on the Puyallup campus. The JSB is named for Chancellor Emerita Michele L. Johnson, who retired in 2022 after a distinguished 45-year career of teaching and leadership at Pierce College. A core principle of the building's design is to be "radically welcoming" in order to remove historic barriers so that students can see the scientific process, imagine themselves as scientists, and transition from observer to innovator.

Central to the design of the 55,000 square foot building is open space designated for students to share their ideas, work together, and relax between classes. The building also offers an array of advanced technology resources including the fabrication lab, where students can design, produce and bring to life their own ideas. The Johnson Science Building also features a sculpture by American glass artist Preston Singletary.

The Johnson Science Building is designed to be a highperformance building while going beyond traditional benchmarks to reduce the carbon emissions and energy footprint of the college campus. Its Energy Use Intensity is 61% of a typical lab building and the JSB is also solar-ready.

The opening of the Johnson Science Building marks a new chapter in STEM education at Pierce College where our students feel empowered to learn and find belonging in our college community.





Pierce College will receive the 2024 Pacific Region Equity Award from the Association of Community College Trustees (ACCT). This recognition demonstrates the college's commitment to creating equitable educational opportunities for underrepresented and underserved communities.

"Equity is foundational to our mission of creating quality educational opportunities for a diverse community of learners to thrive in an evolving world," said Chancellor and CEO Julie White, Ph.D. "As a community of educators, staff, and students, we work every day to fulfill that mission. The ACCT Regional Equity awards program annually honors outstanding contributions to community colleges by recognizing the work of one trustee, equity program, chief executive officer, faculty member, and professional board staff member in each of the organization's five regions. Pierce College's unwavering commitment to increasing access to education and completion, enhancing our workforce and leadership diversity, and building successful community engagement and outreach were vital in receiving this award.

FUNDS FOR COLLEGE ARE YOU INTERESTED IN GOING TO SCHOOL?



The following resources are available to assist with tuition and additional supports while earning a certificate or degree.



Federal and state grants may be awarded to students with financial need. Unlike loans, these do not need to be repaid. Students must complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA) each academic year to receive aid.



Student loans are borrowed money that must be repaid. Some loans are based on financial need, while others are not.



Work Study provides part-time employment to students. This program is available to students enrolled at least part time, and allows students to work both on and off campus. The funds do not need to be repaid.



Scholarships are available from both the college and outside sources. Some scholarships are open to all students in any program, while other scholarships are limited to students in specific programs.

Veterans Benefits are available to assist both veterans and spouses/dependents of veterans.

Worker Retraining may assist with the costs of tuition, books, and transportation for individuals who have received unemployment benefits in the last 48 months, veterans who have separated from the military in the last 48 months, or active duty service members who will separate within the next 12 months.



Opportunity Grants may assist with the costs of tuition, fees, books, and support services to lowincome students in an approved program.

WorkFirst may assist with tuition, books, and support services for students receiving TANF, referred by DSHS, and pursuing an eligible program.



BFET (Basic Food Employment & Training) may assist with tuition, books, and support services for students receiving SNAP and pursuing an eligible program.

The Washington College Grant provides guaranteed college funding through the state to all eligible residents of Washington state, including low- and middle-income students. The first step toward getting funding through the grant is to complete a federal or state financial aid application: Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) or Washington Application for State Financial Aid (WASFA).

For those who qualify, the grant guarantees that you'll get the full Washington College Grant award that you qualify for, eliminating wait lists and letting you start college any quarter with your full grant award.







Many courses also include supplemental learning material, such as assignments, guizzes, audio, video, infographics, and hands-on labs. You do not need to be logged on at a specific time each day.
- What does "Instructor moderated" mean? Instructor-Moderated courses operate on rolling monthly basis, with four available start dates. After enrolling, you will receive new lessons on a set schedule over a six-week period. Two lessons are released each week - one on Wednesday and one on Friday. The final exam is released consecutively with the 12th lesson. You will then have two weeks to complete the exam.
- What does "Self-Paced" mean? Self-Paced Tutorial courses are open enrollment, meaning you can enroll and start a course any time it is convenient. After enrolling, you will receive all lessons immediately and have three months access to complete the course content. Self-Paced Tutorial courses do not have extensions.
